## Wadenswil Pinot Noir

Yamhill-Carlton AVA  
Willamette Valley, Oregon

### *Vintage:*

2021 was a vintage for the books. We saw multiple record breaking heatwaves throughout the valley but luckily, the fruit was not greatly affected from this and continued to ripen at a normal pace with little sign of water stress on our dry farmed vineyards.

The fruit set was above average and the weather leading up to picking time was ideal. The fruit quality was pristine, thanks to the mostly dry conditions. The 2021 vintage will be one to drink in its youth – showing off lush mouthfeels and riper fruit.

Wadenswil is a Swiss clone of Pinot Noir, originally selected by the Swiss Federal Research Center in the town of Wadenswil in 1950 due to its cool climate ripening and disease resistance. Because of these characteristics, it was chosen as one of the first two clones planted in the Willamette Valley.

Planted in 2015, we farm a two acre block of Wadenswil at our Yamhill-Carlton estate vineyard.

Case Production: 150 cases

Production: 100% destemmed, native fermentation bottled unfiltered and unfiltered

Barrel regimen: 10 months in neutral French oak

### **Cellaring:**

Two to eight years post vintage. 2023 – 2029
